News and updates

Department for Education (DfE) visit to Buckinghamshire

The DfE visited Buckinghamshire in late August to check on our progress and we updated them on our ongoing work with the new reforms. The visit went well and we were congratulated on the improved pace of the work on conversions of Statements to Education Health and Care Plans. We were also able to share some of our plans to improve the timeliness and quality of the support we provide to children, young people and their families. The DfE advisor was supportive of these plans including:

- The development of a new process to support children, young people and families who require an EHCP;
- The ongoing development and implementation of the graduated approach;
- Co-production and ensuring a child centred approach to all our work;
- Work to improve the preparation for and transition to adulthood.

We were also able to highlight some of the challenges we face and discuss the national picture relating to SEND. Overall the visit confirmed we are moving in the right direction.

Disability Participation update

Work has now started on transition information for young people approaching 19 years. The information will be displayed as a series of videos following the journey of when a young person's educational provision ends. The first completed video is a tour around Thrift Farm – led by the young people who undertake supported employment there. The video will be available on the local offer website next month.

The SEND youth forum have been very busy feeding into the Early Help Consultation, Independent Travel Training planning and creating a young person's version of the SEND strategy 2017.

The forum also attended the SEND youth forum activity day which was followed by lunch at Pizza Express in High Wycombe.

In the coming months the SEND youth forum will revisit their chosen campaign topic, **bullying** by testing the new bullying reporting platform and app – Tootoot. Following the success of the last activity day the forum have planned another activity day in October Half Term. The day will include participation work on the key priorities for the year along the theme of a 'courtroom drama' – letting the young people act as the Jury in a courtroom scene.

News from Bucks SEND IAS Service

Thank you to those of you who responded to the joint [Bucks SEND IAS Service](#) and [FACT Bucks](#) survey we held in July. The survey aimed to capture your experience of the [Special Educational Needs and Disabilities \(SEND\) reforms](#) in Buckinghamshire – these are the reforms stemming from the Children and Families Act 2014 - such as the person-centred approach, co-production, SEN Support, Education, Health and Care Plans, Personal Budgets, the Local Offer.

We are pleased to report that we received 90 responses. Key messages include:

- The processes families go through to get support are not straightforward.
- Getting in touch with professionals is often difficult.
- 44% of respondents agreed that professionals involved in assessing and reviewing their child's needs communicate in a way they understand
- 58% of respondents said that they know about the Buckinghamshire [Local Offer](#).
- We are proud to say that nearly 70% of respondents said that Bucks SEND IAS Service helped them to obtain the support their child needs.

The full dataset is being analysed and a more detailed joint SEND IAS/ FACT Bucks report will be shared with you and with other key stakeholders including the Local Authority and Clinical Commissioning Groups in the next few weeks.
