## Exciting news!

I'm delighted to inform you that big improvements are coming to HCJS—and soon! After a lot of work behind the scenes, Bucks County Council has given the green light for alterations that will help accommodate our expanding village. With the increased capacity at Haddenham St Mary's School and the general rise in demand for places at HCJS, our governors have agreed to raise our Pupil Admission Number (PAN) to 90. This gives us the capacity for 3 classes of 30 in each year group. And increased numbers mean increased funding!

We'll be starting work this Easter holidays on enlarging and refurbishing four of our classrooms revamping our cloakrooms and creating new storage areas—not to mention that new library I wrote about in the last newsletter! It is a very exciting time here at HCJS, and I will keep you updated with news on the project as it progresses over the next six months. **Andy Leach**

## Our new Mini MUGA

If you've heard your child talking about 'the mugger at school', don't panic—they mean the MUGA, or Multi-Use Games Area. We've recently invested in a Mini MUGA to make playtime even more fun. With heavy-duty barriers and new mini goal nets, the Mini MUGA enables us to section off an area of the North playground so that children can try out different sports and games during playtime. **Supervised** weekly activities will include Futsal/urban football, Unihoc (a game derived from hockey) and even Boccia (a variant of bowls/boules). Over the next year or so, this area of the school grounds, which is next to the climbing wall and tyre parks, will become our 'activity zone', while most of the front playground and the shelters near the South area entrance will be designated a ball-free quiet zone.

## Readers' Corner

Mrs Palmer, our Head of Upper School, recommends: **A Street Cat Called Bob** by James Bowen

This is a firm favourite of mine—heart-warming and a real page-turner. Bob is a ginger cat who finds a new owner in James, a homeless busker, and helps turn both their lives around. It can be dark in places, but the series—which includes Bob, No Ordinary Cat; For The Love of Bob; and A Gift From Bob—has been adapted so that children from Year 6 and up can learn about life on the streets and how compassion and resourcefulness can overcome adversity. For younger readers, My Name Is Bob is a beautiful illustrated version that can fire discussion about homelessness. The original was turned into a film in 2016, but it's always best to read the book—so much better for the imagination!
