A new means of communication

Hello one and all and welcome to the first HCJS Headteacher bulletin. With the launch of our new school app at the start of this term, I have decided to take a slightly different approach to my written communication from now on. Secondary focus

It will not be news to many of you that the situation with secondary school places for Haddenham children has become a little more complicated in recent times. The growth of Thame, coupled with an increase in out of catchment siblings being offered places last year meant that on the first round of allocation a significant minority of our pupils we not offered their first choice of Lord Williams's school for September 2018. Ultimately, all of these pupils were offered places in a later round of allocations as a result of admissions appeal - they did so however by successfully arguing that the definition of 'partnership' school was misleading. This is a 'loophole' that has subsequently been closed down. When viewing the Lord Williams's School website one comes across the following sentence on the 'Thame Partnership page'......

We also work closely with the following schools, **which are not feeder schools** for the purpose of admissions (emphasis added):

HCJS is listed alongside a number of other local schools. This comes hot on the heels of a grumpy email I received recently from Oxfordshire school admissions asking me to make clear to you that HCJS is NOT in the Lord Williams's catchment and NEITHER is it a 'FEEDER' school. I do so here-knowing full well that it will cause a level of anxiety in certain quarters.

Put simply - parents living in Haddenham can no longer assume (if indeed they ever did!) of a secondary school place at lord Williams's school Thame. I have said this many times in public, not least at the annual secondary transfer meeting - but now I commit those words to paper!

With that in mind I have embarked upon a 'grand tour of local secondary school' last week I visited Princes Risborough and Aylesbury Grammar School.

What did I find on those visits.....?

To be honest, I was very impressed on both occasions - I was met by passionate and committed school leaders who have both have a clear vision for their respective organisations. I met friendly and welcoming staff and polite and well behaved pupils. I would happily send my own boys to either school (different as they are from one another).

Due to the mixed destination pattern of our year 6 pupils onward school journey, I am very committed to working closely with not just these two schools, but with any others that receive HCJS pupils. We are actively looking to strengthen our links with both schools, but I particularly hope to put our 'partnership' with Princes Risborough on a similar footing to that which we enjoy with Lord Williams's particularly given that as Oxfordshire county Council helpfully pointed out to me in their email unlike the later, the former is a link

Our initial links with Risborough are likely to be sporting ones; look out for details in the near future.

I am always proud of our pupils, but this week I had particular cause to be so:




And Finally......
