## Financial Pressures and How You Can Help

The <u>2024 National Governors Survey</u> (covering over 3,000 governors and trustees in England) has revealed that 60% of schools and trusts see balancing their budgets as their biggest current challenge—a significant rise from 44% in 2022. Alarmingly, only 18% consider themselves financially sustainable, and 50% report that the condition of their school buildings negatively impacts the learning environment.

These findings certainly reflect our own experience here at HCJS. Like many others, we are facing growing financial pressures and difficult decisions as we work to maintain and improve the learning environment for our children.

You may have seen our recent message via Weduc about the **Nest Garden project**. If you're able to donate any of the requested items, we'd be incredibly grateful. In the past, we haven't often had to ask for help, but with current budget constraints, we're finding it increasingly difficult to fund improvements to our grounds and facilities. We may need to reach out more often—and if you're able to support us in any way, shape, or form, please do get in touch. We'd love to hear from you.

One more challenge we're navigating is the **loss of our former PTA**, which has had a significant impact on our ability to run events and fundraise. Please see the separate article below for more on this and how we're hoping to move forward.

#### **Attendance Matters**

Regular school attendance is crucial to every child's academic success, emotional development, and overall well-being. A consistent presence in the classroom ensures that students benefit fully from the structured learning environment, peer interaction, and the continuity of education that underpins long-term achievement.

Research consistently shows that even small amounts of missed school can significantly affect a child's performance and confidence, particularly when absences occur during term time. Gaps in learning can lead to difficulties keeping up with work, disrupted routines, and increased anxiety when returning to school.

I wrote to you earlier this academic year explaining my concern on how term time holidays and unauthorised days were impacting our school's attendance. We understand that many families have booked holidays or made travel plans and we have honoured any booked pre-existing holidays for this academic year. However, from September 2025 we will be implementing penalty notices in line with the local authority guidance for unauthorised days taken during term time.

Penalty notice are fines and will be issued for more than 5 unauthorised days (or 10 sessions) of recreational or holiday-related absences taken during term time within any rolling 10-week period. This includes non-consecutive absences. For example, taking the last 2 days of one term and the first 3 days of the following term would count as 5 days and fall within the scope of this policy. The fine is typically £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 if not. This change is being made to encourage families to plan holidays outside of term time, ensuring that pupils can access the full benefit of their education without interruption.

We recognise that occasional absences are sometimes unavoidable, and all requests for leave during term time should continue to be submitted in writing. We retain the discretion to authorise absences under exceptional circumstances.

We appreciate your cooperation and commitment to your child's education. By working together, we can support a learning environment where all students thrive and reach their full potential.
