Mrs Duncan has done a fantastic job of putting together an event that showcases and celebrates what wonderful talent we have in our school. There will be art work to peruse, music and singing to enjoy, a craft table for little ones, a raffle and a bar for the adults. We hope to see as many of you as possible on Friday.

Reach More Parents - Weduc Newsfeed.

I've mentioned this before, but a quick scroll through Our (Reach More Parents) Weduc newsfeed really is the very best way to keep an eye on all the wonderful things that go on at HCJS. Our staff strive hard to provide curriculum enrichment and learning that takes our pupils beyond classroom based learning. By way of example, between Easter and the end of the last half term our pupils took part in a 'Wizz Fizz Fest' art workshop, a 'Roundnet' day, 'Monarchy' drama workshop during the coronation celebrations, a Shakespeare workshop (on Hamlet), and zoom calls with an anatomy expert on the circulatory system and a marine biologist (from the Smithsonian in California). In addition, we hosted our first ever Board Games Cafe and Year 6 children gave two amazing performances at the Haddenham St Mary's School Dance Festival. Premises News

You will, no doubt, have found it hard to miss the new gates and fencing at the front of the school. The security system for the gates will go live within the next week and when that happens, you will need to buzz the school reception via the intercom at the main

pedestrian gate if you require access to the site during school hours. We will ensure the gates are open during drop off and collection times, to allow unhindered entrance and exit during our busiest periods of the day. The gate will be shut at all other times.

The car park gate will remain closed at all times, as access to the school car park is now reserved for staff, visiting professionals, deliveries and those parents and carers requiring emergency access only. If you are one of those few people who currently sneak in to drop off or collect your child - please be aware that this will no longer be possible going forward. I realise this may be a minor inconvenience at first, but I'm sure we will all adjust quickly - it will, of course, be familiar to those of you whose children attended either of the Haddenham infant schools.

The bungalow conversion project is nearing completion and will be available for us to use from September.

And... we have (with significant support from our brilliant PTA) installed a new covered shelter/gazebo in the main quad - This is intended to be used for quiet reading / small group work (on fine days) and a calm, quiet space for pupils to relax in at lunch time. Pencil cases and stationery. Help required please.

During the Covid period of restrictions, we took the decision to provide pencil cases and items of stationery to all our pupils, this was for hygiene reasons and was not something we had previously done. Although we no longer provide pencil cases, we have continued to provide many items of stationery since the return to school post pandemic, but the cost of this policy is starting to bite, and given our significant spend on such items, your help would be much appreciated.

With the summer holidays ahead, to prepare for next academic year, I thought it would be useful to share with all of you the information recently sent out to our new Year 3 starters for September:

Could I ask respectfully that if possible you provide the following items for your child. We will continue to provide all items for those unable to purchase them (if this is the case for you, please contact the School Office).

Your child will need a small, plain, zipped pencil case with the following items:

- Writing pencils, colouring pencils & a pencil sharpener.
- A Pritt Stick and a pair of safety scissors. (optional but very useful).

• A suitable handwriting pen (with blue ink) which can be used with agreement from the class teacher.

Please ensure that all items are named.

We ask you not to purchase large, bright or distracting pencil cases such as those sold in Smiggle. If your child brings in an unsuitable pencil case we will ask them to take it back home with them and will ask you to provide a more suitable one.

Uniform

I've copied the following paragraph directly from a previous newsletter. I felt it was worth a reminder!

We have a very large supply of previously owned uniform, which we can pass on to you at much reduced cost. Please contact the school office for further information if you feel this would be helpful. If this is the case they simply can't be returned and so after a set period of time we add them to our 'to be sold' pile.

At Haddenham Junior School, we acknowledge the importance of sun protection and want staff and pupils to enjoy the sun safely.
