

MOVING UP TO **SECONDARY SCHOOL**

For parents applying for a Year 7 school place for **September 2019**



Moving up to Secondary School



This leaflet gives you some background information about your child's move to secondary school. It also explains how to apply for their secondary school place.

Buckinghamshire is a selective county, which means that we have upper/all-ability schools and grammar schools. Most children will sit the Secondary Transfer Test and the outcome of this decides which type of school is suitable for your child.

You will make your application for a secondary school to the Local Authority (LA) in whose area you live. Buckinghamshire parents will be able to list up to six schools located in any area on that application. All LAs share preference information with each other, where necessary.

Secondary Transfer Test

Children who go to a Buckinghamshire LA primary school are automatically entered for the Secondary Transfer Test unless you let your child's headteacher know that this is not what you want. Think carefully whether a grammar school would be suitable for your child.

Make sure you speak to your child's headteacher if you think they might not be able to access the Secondary Transfer Test because they have a disability or Special Educational Needs.

You should also speak to your child's headteacher if your child is working outside of the age range for their year group.

Children will be given a Familiarisation booklet in the summer term of Year 5. The Practice Test will take place in the autumn term of Year 6.

Please see the timeline later in this leaflet for the Practice and Secondary Transfer Test dates. We will let you know your child's Secondary Transfer Test results in October. If your child does not qualify by scoring 121 or more, we will let you know what your options are.

Only qualified children can be considered for a grammar school.

What to do first -

Visit our website www.buckscc.gov.uk/movinguptosecondaryschool

to view information about moving up to secondary school and the Secondary Transfer Testing Process. You will also find it useful to visit the website at key points throughout the year. If you do not have access to a computer, you can ask us to send you a copy of the information on our website.

The website will be fully updated with the information about moving up to secondary school in September 2019 by early August.

The 'Find my child a school place' service on the website not only contains admission information for all the secondary schools in Buckinghamshire but their Open Events too. These will be held in the summer and autumn terms. It is important to visit a number of schools so you can decide which you think would best suit your child. We suggest you visit your nearest and catchment schools, even if you are not sure whether they would meet your child's needs, so you can make an informed application.

How are places allocated?

When schools have more applications than there are places available, admission rules are used to decide who will be allocated a place. More

information about admission rules is available from 'Find my child a school place'. Different schools can have different admission rules so it is important that you check them carefully. It is also helpful to check the admission rules for any schools in other areas that you are interested in.

Some schools also have a supplementary form for you to fill in if you are listing their school on your application. Check the School Directory available via 'Find my child a school place'.

Distance is used in the admission rules to help us work out who can be offered a place. All Buckinghamshire schools use straight line distance.

Buckinghamshire LA operates an Equal Preference scheme. This means that the preference number you have given each school (1st – 6th) does not affect how likely it is that you will get a place. If your child can be offered more than one school during the allocation process, we will offer the place at the school that you have listed higher on your application.

You should list the schools on your application in the order you would like them.

Moving up to Secondary School



How to apply – Buckinghamshire residents only

Please see the deadlines in the timeline later in this leaflet.

You can apply online using a laptop, desktop, smart phone or tablet. Our system is safe and easy to use. You simply set up a username (your email address) and password, fill in your child's details and list up to six preferences for secondary schools.

Apply online from 11 September 2018 at www.buckscc.gov.uk

You will automatically be sent an email, confirming which schools you have applied for:

You can log back in to change your application at any time before the deadline

You can apply online from a library if you don't have a computer at home. You might be able to use a computer at your child's current school. If you cannot apply online, you must let your child's school know and they will give you a paper form. Make sure you apply by the deadline.

Either way, we ask you to provide us with evidence of where you live when you complete your application. See the website for a list of documents that you can choose from

If you apply online, you will be able to know which school we have offered your child a day early. You can log on to your account on I March 2019 and check which school has been offered. You will also get this information in an email.

lf you apply with a paper form, we will post you a letter on I March 2019.

School Transport

The Council provides free school transport to secondary school pupils of statutory school age (Years 7 – 11) who

- a) attend their nearest school (as measured by road) and
- b) live over the statutory walking distance of 3 miles

If you express a preference for a school that is not your nearest and place it above your nearest school on your application (or omit your nearest school) and your child is allocated your preferred school, you will not be entitled to free transport. Also, if we offer you a non-preference school and you have not expressed a preference for your nearest school we will not provide free transport. We do not provide transport to your catchment school, unless it is also the nearest. For grammar qualified children an upper/all-ability school may be nearest. To be clear, transport is not provided to a child's nearest grammar school if it is not the nearest school.

If your child has a sibling who is already attending your preference school, AND is already on free school transport, please do not assume that your secondary transfer child would also be entitled to free school transport.

If you know your child is not entitled to free transport you may wish to consider paid-for transport - spare seats are sold on existing school transport. Please visit www.buckscc.gov.uk/services/education/school-transport/paid-for-school-transport/

If assistance with home to school transport is important to you, you will need to consider this when making your secondary school application. Please ensure you are familiar with the full School Transport Policy before making your application. Consider how your child will get to school if not entitled to free school transport.

This policy summary is based on legislation and council policy for statutory school age children and this may change in the future.

Timeline – What happens when?

This is a very brief timeline to give you some of the important dates that you need to know about if you are a Buckinghamshire resident.

From June to Oct 2018	
11 Sept 2018	Make your application online at www.buckscc.gov.uk from this date.
11 Sept 2018	
13 Sept 2018	Children take the Secondary Transfer Test.
12 Oct 2018	
18 Oct 2018	We recommend that you have applied online or sent in your paper form by this date to make sure you receive acknowledgement of receipt in good time.
31 Oct 2018 - 3pm	
1 Mar 2019	Secondary school places are offered. Parents who applied online will receive an email and can also log on to check which school has been offered. Offer letters are posted where necessary.
